Anyone who is a resident of Winkler, Morden, Altona, the RM of Stanley, Rhineland Municipality, RM of Thompson, or RM of Pembina can get a library membership at no cost. **Students who live outside our catchment area but attend a local school can get a card for a one-year term by showing their student ID card or bringing a letter from the school confirming that they are enrolled there.**

Think outside the library

Remote access to our resources could be very helpful in your classroom.

You can search our catalog from home to find resources on a particular subject.

Your students can use Mango Languages as part of introductory language learning, possibly as curriculum enrichment—and they can do that anywhere they have internet access.



Keep In Mind...

Often, the students who would benefit most from the library are the ones who don't know it's available to them. Bring them to us, and help them to sign up for cards. The more familiar the library is to them in early years, the more likely it is that they'll keep coming over holidays and throughout their lives.



Cards for the Class

If you would like your students to get library cards when they come to the library, you'll need to do some advance work, and we'll need at least a week's notice.

If your students are 13 years or older, bring the Branch Librarian a class list that includes the following information:

-  Name (first, last, middle initial)
-  Mailing Address
-  Physical Address (if different from mailing address)
-  Phone Number
-  Whether or not the student already has a card

When you come to the library, the students will need to sign a form and their library card.

If your students are 12 or younger, we'll provide you with forms that the parents will need to fill out and sign. These completed forms will need to be dropped off at the library a week before your tour date.
