## Where can I go for online learning resources?

All of the following online resources are available free for library card holders to use:

**EBSCOhost Research Databases** – provides a complete and optimized research solution comprised of e-journals, e-books, and research databases.

EBSCOhost Canadian Reference Centre — (part of Main EBSCOdatabase includes leading Canadian periodicals and international periodicals in full text; full-text reference books; thousands of full-text biographies and an image collection for thousands of photos, maps and flags, including images from Canadian Press.

**eLibraries Manitoba** – a collection of eBooks and eAudio books.

**Explora** – EBSCO's interface for Schools and Public Libraries, it supports both student research and classroom instruction with simple searches that quickly deliver relevant results, easy-to-browse categories, topic overviews, and much more.

**Kanopy** – Offers video streaming for libraries with one of the largest and most unique collections in the world featuring over 26,000 movies, documentaries, indie and foreign films.

**Khan Academy**— learn for free about math, art, computer programming, economics, physics, chemistry, biology, medicine, finance, history and more. All grade levels.

NoveList Plus – the premiere database of reading recommendations, available through libraries around the world. It is a comprehensive source of information about books that includes expert recommendations, reviews, articles, lists and more.

<u>Tumble Books</u> – an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach kids the joy of reading in a format they'll love.

World Book Online – offers an encyclopedia, dictionary, atlas, homework help, study aids, and curriculum guides. Additional features include translations into 30 languages, text-to-speech capabilities, learning and life skills activities, and interactive video.

<u>Duolingo</u> – Learn many languages including Spanish, French, German, Italian, Russian and English. Practice speaking, reading, listening and writing skills while playing a game!

Canadian Encyclopedia – A comprehensive information source about Canada and Canadians, for students, the general public and scholars. Includes articles written by experts, as well as web links and multimedia clips. The web site also includes links to the Youth Encyclopedia of Canada and Encyclopedia of Music in Canada. No library card is required to access these resources on the Internet.
